CHECK OUT THESE TIPS!

Start Early & Manage Your Time

Don't wait until the last minute to start your application. Take the time to think about the essays and make sure your references get their information in on time.



If you have a question - ask it! This is not the time to figure it out on your own. It could literally cost you money.

Keep Activity Records

Record everything you do with clubs, volunteer organizations, classes and church activities. Include your role and time spent. Then you can organize your records to include this information in your application.

Put Effort Into Your Essays

This is where you get to show the evaluators who you are and what you're all about.

Proofread, Proofread, Proofread

Proofread your essays and make sure your grammar and spelling are correct. Capitalization is important! Check for lower case i's.

ASK your teacher, counselor, parent or friend to help you proofread your work.

DOES IT MAKE SENSE?

Over Explain

WRITE out the names of organizations you're involved in instead of using the acronyms. For example, "Health Occupations Students of America" has more meaning than "HOSA."

SHOW your true self in your answers. We want to know about you and why you are a good investment.
