The ETCF Scholarship Handbook provides valuable scholarship information to students pursuing an education beyond high school. Most of the scholarships listed in this guide are for high school seniors, however, there are also several opportunities for students already enrolled in college and/or non-traditional students.

There are literally thousands of national and local scholarships available to students. This directory features scholarships available specifically to students in East Texas. Students are encouraged to apply for as many scholarships as they qualify for. Multiple scholarships can be awarded to a single student resulting in a substantial cumulative amount. All scholarship dollars that are awarded aid in off-setting tuition expenses and fees.

Our scholarships are broken down by county, so this directory allows you to see a snapshot of what is available to you based on the county your high school is located in. Then we offer a more in-depth description of the opportunities so you can determine if you meet the eligibility requirements. Most of our opportunities are part of the universal application so you only have to answer the questions one time and it will populate to all the opportunities you are eligible for. You will have to hit [SUBMIT] on each individual application and answer any supplemental questions that might be specific to one opportunity.

We hope this directory is a helpful resource as you consider the numerous scholarship opportunities available to you. TIMELINE TO APPLY

Start a record of your extracurricular activities, clubs, teams, and community involvement and volunteering. Include EVERYTHING!



Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FASFA) early. The application should open on October 1st.

Start your scholarship application early! Our application opens January 1st and closes March 1st.

Write and review your essays. Have a friend, parent or teacher review and/or proof/edit them for you.



Mark your calendar! Review, finalize and submit all applications before the March 1st deadline. Make sure all supporting documents are also submitted.

We will not accept an application after the due date.

REMINDERS:

- You will need **two letters of reference.** Neither can be a family member.
 - one must have had in-classroom experience with you
 - one needs to be a character reference (employer, family friend, teacher, etc.)
- You will need to upload an unofficial transcript that includes your grades from the **fall semester of your senior year**.
- You will need your FAFSA information at least the first 2 pages which include our **Student Aid Index (SAI) & your name** (both are required to be considered complete).
- Make sure that everything is entered correctly & properly uploaded before you submit. You will not be able to edit or make changes after you submit your application.

UNIVERSAL APPLICATION OPPORTUNITIES BY COUNTY

The East Texas Communities Foundation utilizes a universal application to make the application process as easy as possible for students. Students will have the opportunity to complete a series of eligibility questions, determine what scholarship opportunities they are eligible for, provide the required information and submit multiple applications from the online portal. The Universal Application will pre-populate all the "universal" information to all applications so they are only having to enter the information once. They will then need to submit each individual opportunity.

UNIVERSAL APPLICATION OPPORTUNITIES IN ALPHABETICAL ORDER

Acosta Family Charitable Scholarship: Established in 2021 by the Jesse Acosta Family, this scholarship is to be awarded to a graduating high school senior from Chapel Hill High School. Applicants are invited to apply and are nominated by Chapel Hill ISD teachers.

- <u>High School/Residency:</u> Applicant must be a graduating senior from Chapel Hill High School in Smith County, Texas.
- Academic Record: Applicants must have achieved a minimum GPA of at least 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale).
- <u>College/University to be Attended:</u> Recipient may attend any accredited college or university in the United States.
- College Major: Recipient may major in any subject.
- Financial Need: Financial need will be a secondary consideration.
- Other Eligibility Requirements: Applicants must have participated & been involved in any school activity (sports, clubs, student organizations, etc.) and/or community activity (service, church, etc.) or be able to explain why they did not participate in either (i.e. work or family demands).
- Length of Support: This scholarship will be awarded for one year only.

\$500 has been awarded but may vary depending on funds available and number of scholarships issued.

A.D. & Mary Winston Scholarship: The A.D. and Mary Winston Scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior from a Smith County public high school entering Texas A&M University.

- <u>High School/Residency:</u> Applicants must be a resident of Smith County and a graduating senior at any public high school within Smith County.
- Academic Record: Applicants must have achieved a minimum GPA of at least 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale).
- College/University to be Attended: Recipient must be admitted to attend Texas A&M University. (Blinn TEAM does not qualify.)
- <u>College Major:</u> Recipient may major in any subject.
- <u>Financial Need:</u> Financial need will be a secondary consideration.
- Length of Support: This scholarship will be awarded for one year only.

\$1,500 has been awarded but may vary depending on funds available and number of scholarships issued.

Adam Carroll Scholarship: Established in 2002 with gifts from the family and friends of Adam Carroll, this scholarship honors the memory of a young man known for his love of people, his zest for life and his love of sports. An honor graduate of Grand Saline High School, Adam was a gifted baseball player, a handsome guy with an infectious smile, and a young man who had big dreams for his life. One of Adam's favorite sayings was "Always remember who you are, where you come from and what you represent." Adam Carroll knew who he was, he knew where he came from, both geographically and spiritually, and he knew he represented his family, his school and his Lord. The Adam Carroll Scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior of Grand Saline High School who has participated in high school athletics or cheerleading.

- <u>High School/Residency:</u> Applicants must be a graduating senior from Grand Saline High School and a resident of Van Zandt, Wood, or Smith County.
- Academic Record: Applicants must have achieved a minimum GPA of at least 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale).
- College/University to be Attended: Recipient may attend any accredited college or university in the United States.
- College Major: Recipient may major in any subject.
- <u>Financial Need:</u> Financial need will be a secondary consideration.
- Other Eligibility Requirements: Applicants must have participated in high school athletics or cheerleading.
- <u>Length of Support:</u> This scholarship will be awarded for one year only.

\$1,000 has been awarded but may vary depending on funds available and number of scholarships issued.

Alex Fleming Infinity Scholarship: Born December 4, 1989, in Bedford, Texas, Alex Fleming was a junior at Whitehouse High School, where he was respected and admired by students and teachers alike for his numerous achievements. Alex was a member of the National Honor Society, a varsity football and track letterman, and played for the junior varsity baseball team. Moreover, he distinguished himself through his involvement in the Whitehouse High School Band and Jazz Band. The purpose of the Alex Fleming Infinity Scholarship Fund is to provide a scholarship to a graduating senior at Whitehouse High School who has participated in the band program for 4 years and shows high moral character. This is a merit based scholarship, and preference will be given to students who have participated successfully in the honors academic program.

- High School/Residency Applicants: Applicants must be a graduating senior at Whitehouse High School.
- <u>Academic Record:</u> Preference will be given to students who have participated successfully in the honors academic program.
- College/University to be Attended: Recipient may attend any accredited college/university in the United States.
- College Major: Recipient may major in any subject.
- Financial Need: Financial need is not a consideration.
- Other Eligibility Requirements: Applicants must have participated in the band for 4 years.
- Length of Support: This scholarship will be awarded for one year only.

\$1,250 has been awarded but may vary depending on funds available and number of scholarships issued.

Allen and Nancy Locklin Scholarship: The Allen and Nancy Locklin Scholarship is awarded to a graduating high school senior from Smith County who plans to attend the University of Texas at Tyler, shows outstanding citizenship and leadership qualities, Christian devotion, excellent moral character, and demonstrates a commitment to community service.

- <u>High School/Residency:</u> Applicants must be a graduating senior from a public, private or home school in Smith County.
- Academic Record: Applicants must have achieved a minimum GPA of at least 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale).
- <u>College/University to be Attended:</u> Recipients must plan to enroll as a full-time student at the University of Texas at Tyler.
- College Major: Recipient may major in any subject.
- Financial Need: Financial need will be a secondary consideration.
- Length of Support: The scholarship is renewable for up to 4 years (a total of 5 years) if the student:
 - Remains a full-time student (at least 12 hours) at the University of Texas at Tyler
 - Maintains a 3.0 cumulative GPA or higher (on a 4.0 scale)

\$2,000 has been awarded but may vary depending on funds available and number of scholarships issued.

Barbara Bass Community College Scholarship: This scholarship was established to honor Barbara Bass's years of service as mayor of the City of Tyler. The recipient must be a resident of Tyler.

- <u>High School/Residency:</u> Applicants must be a resident within the city limits of Tyler, Texas, and a graduating senior in a public, private or homeschool high school.
- <u>Academic Record:</u> Applicants must have achieved a minimum GPA of at least a 3.0 *(on a 4.0 scale)*.
